## **Sunday's Sermon & Scripture**

# Being Church When the Building is Empty ... Bodies Matter

So when it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and when the doors were shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." And when He had said this, He showed them both His hands and His side. The disciples then rejoiced when they saw the Lord. So Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup> If you forgive the sins of any, their sins have been forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they have been retained."

But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples were saying to him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to

them, "Unless I see in His hands the imprint of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe."

After eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors having been shut, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then He said to Thomas, "Reach here with your finger, and see My hands; and reach here your hand and put it into My side; and do not be unbelieving, but believing." Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen Me, have you believed? Blessed are they who did not see, and yet believed."

Therefore many other signs Jesus also performed in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; <sup>31</sup> but these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name.

## **Once There Was a Little Bunny...**

It is easy to say don't worry, but actually doing it is much harder. During the pandemic, it might be harder still. Now there are fewer distractions and more things to fret over. When my girls were small, I would read them Margaret Wise Brown's book, *The Runaway Bunny*. It begins:

Once there was a little bunny who wanted to run away. So he said to his mother, "I am running away."

"If you run away," said his mother, "I will run after you. For you are my little bunny."

"If you run after me," said the little bunny, "I will become a fish in a trout stream and I will swim away from you."

"If you become a fish in a trout stream," said his mother, "I will become a fisherman and I will fish for you."

On the story goes, with the little bunny saying he will become a rock on a mountain or a crocus in a garden, a tree or a circus performer and each time the mother responds with how she will find him. Finally, the little bunny says, "Shucks, I might just as well stay where I am

and be your little bunny." It is a kind of little allegory of the soul. No matter where we hide, God will find us, out of love and a desire for connection.

The Runaway Bunny reminds me of Psalm 139, "<sup>9</sup>If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, <sup>10</sup>even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast.

<sup>11</sup>If I say, 'Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light around me become night,'

<sup>12</sup>even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you" (Psalm 139:9-12)

The psalm reminds me of God's faithfulness. God will never desert or abandon us. He sees through our darkness and brings the light that cuts through the gloom of worry. At the end of Margaret Wise Brown's story, love triumphs and trumps all else. I know that my faithfulness cannot match God's divine steadfastness but I can rest secure in the love that is with me in all circumstances. With that assurance I can lay my worries aside.

# **Spoofing**

Recently my cell phone information was spoofed, a kind of scam that hopes to collect money or gift cards



from individuals. Well-run criminal enterprises will target people who are church members by impersonating church staff, especially pastors. The most requested items in this type of scam are the purchase of prepaid gift cards or simply a response, which then makes someone vulnerable to future targeted campaigns.

The practice of spoofing makes it look like an email or text is being sent from a trusted source rather than a scammer. Spoofing is usually not related to the hacking of emails or phones, according to Bryan Crompton, Virginia Conference Manager of Technology. These scammers impersonate their targets through phone numbers (calling and texting) as well as email by gathering data quickly from a basic search online.

As a pastor, I would never ask someone for money or gift cards through an email or text message. Often criminals will use a slightly different email or cellphone number from the one that belongs to the person they are impersonating. If you receive a suspicious message that appears to be from me, look carefully at the sender

information. Two members of a church in Harrisonburg were each swindled out of \$500 last fall when their pastor was impersonated.
