Drive In Church Starting Sunday, June 7

As restrictions brought about by COVID-19 are lifted in parts of Virginia, Bethany United Methodist Church will begin holding "drive-in" worship services starting June 7, 2020. I know that the worship

team is excited by this opportunity to hold a more personal form of worship. Members of the team have been working long and hard in the midst of rapid changes and challenges.

While we wish with all our hearts we could just throw open the doors of the church and welcome everyone in for worship, I know that doing so could be dangerous and even deadly. The Virginia Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church has provided detailed guidelines for the drive-in services and for everyone's health and safety and we will be following them.

- First and foremost, do not come to the drive-in service if you are running a fever or are feeling sick.
- Everyone who comes to our drive-in service will need to register by email (office.bethany@gmail.com) or by phone (540.234.8880) no later than the Thursday before

the service by 2 pm. This is so we know we will have enough parking for everyone.

- Let us know how many will be in the vehicle, especially how many children will be present.
- The service will be broadcast over an FM radio channel and when you register we will send you the station for the broadcast and a song sheet so you can sing along with the worship songs.
- We will also have a dedicated cell phone number so you can text your prayer concerns during the service and we will send that to you as well.
- There will be a parking team to direct where each vehicle will park. Vehicles will park in every other space.
- Everyone is being asked to remain in their vehicles for the entire service.
- The building is to remain locked, but please bring face masks in case an emergency occurs that would require you to exit the vehicle.

If you want to drop off your offering, there will be marked stations with collection buckets at various spots in the parking lot, but online giving is still available. If you would like to review the Conference's reopening documents, they are available at VAUMC.org/return/ or you can download the reopen handbook at http://doc.vaumc.org/News2020/ HandbookforLocalChurches.pdf.

We will continue to do a Facebook Live service and post the video to the mybethanyumc.org website. if you have questions about the drive-in worship service, please call me at 757.653.7830 or the church office at 540.234.8880.

Remember, the only thing we want to transmit on Sundays is the good news of Jesus Christ, who offers us abundant life.

As for an update on our finances, our budgeted needs through May 18 is \$90,803, our receipts of gifts to date are \$78,551. This puts us at around \$12,000 behind budget for the year. At this point we have paid \$63,800 in expenses and currently have another \$6,400 due.

Obviously, since we are not meeting, some expenses are not as high as normal. Others however, are ongoing and do not change. Please continue your faithful support as the church, like each of us, navigates the challenges this year brings.

As we officially begin summer, and honor the fallen defenders of our freedom, I wish you all the best for the summer and the remainder of 2020. Keep the faith until we can all worship together again at Bethany!

Cleaning Kits

The Virginia General Conference is in need of "cleaning kits" and are asking churches to help supply them. Putting together an entire kit can be a little expensive. However, if you can donate a few items to place in the kit, we have volunteers who will gladly put the buckets together. If you have any questions, please contact Rosemary Wagoner at rosway13@gmail.com.

Here is a list of items needed for the buckets ...

- 1 five-gallon round bucket with lid (no screw lids) (14.35" h x 12.19" w x 12.19 d) The bucket may be used, but must be free from all residual product. Advertisement on the outside is acceptable.
- 1 32-64 oz. bottle of liquid laundry detergent
- 1 16-40 oz. bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner (no spray cleaners)
- 1 16-34 oz. bottle of liquid dish soap
- 1 4-8 oz. pump stray air freshener (3 solid or 3 gel fresheners also acceptable)
- 1 6-14 oz. spray insect repellant (pump spray bottles must have protective covers) Packs of 10-20 wipes are also acceptable.
- 1 scrub brush with or without a handle
- 8 reusable cleaning wipes removed from packaging (no terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels)
- 5 scouring pads removed from packaging (no stainless steel or pads with soap in them)
- 36-50 clothespins
- 1 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24 roll of heavy duty trash bags removed from packaging (33-45 gallon size)
- 5 N-95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3 mm thickness ... no surgical masks)
- 2 pairs of kitchen gloves removed from packaging and durable for multiple uses
- 1 pair of work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather)

There will be a bin outside the main church doors so you can drop off your donations at any time. Thanks in advance for your support!




