From the Pastor's Desk . . .

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 1:3)

The apostle Paul opened almost all of his letters to the churches he helped to found with this very special phrase. It is no accident that the very first word of this formal address is "grace". And it is no accident that it is the very first word from me to you! Grace has been the first word in the Christian movement since its very beginning. Grace is the very foundation of the Christian message. As Christians, and especially as United Methodists, we are all familiar with this word and its meaning: the unearned and undeserved love and blessings of God.

Jesus was all about grace. He told many stories that tried to help people understand that they didn't have to earn God's love; that God's love was poured out on all of God's

creation, even on those whom the religious folks of Jesus day and age felt were the least deserving of all. Folks like sinners, and tax collectors, and Samaritans, and lepers. The story of "The Prodigal Son" (Luke 15:11-32) and the story of "The Workers in the Vineyard" (Matthew 20:1-16) are classic examples of stories about the grace of God. These stories are about God's grace, but they also emphasize the fact that it is a part of our human nature to be offended by grace. We have this built in idea that everything should be fair, that people should get what they deserve. And so, the elder brother in the story of "The Prodigal Son" was offended that the younger brother was let off the hook with no

consequences for his reckless actions. The workers in the vineyard who had gone out to work early in the morning were offended that the workers who only worked the last few hours of the day received as much pay as they did.

Can you see how offensive grace can be? As modern-day Christians we still struggle with this notion of grace, especially when we see things through the eyes of the world. But when we see things through God's eyes we can begin to understand the mystery of grace. It is my prayer that as we grow together "in grace" we may all come to understand this a little better ourselves.

A huge THANK YOU to all the youth and adults who participated in the Youth Mission Trip to NC this year. We can't wait to hear all about it. Thank you to all the church members who donated money or food for this trip to happen. We couldn't do it without the help of all in the church. Thank you.

Thank you to all who donated kits for conference this year. We greatly appreciated it.

The weekend of Aug 6th -8th is the "no tax" weekend and Stuff the Bus in VA. If you are able, please go by a local Wal-Mart and make a monetary donation or buy some school supplies to donate to give to the kids in the county of the Wal-Mart that you visited.

We are still taking gently used clothing donations for the Green Hanger Project all year. Make sure to label your box or bag with "Green

Hanger". No holes or stains, please. You can also donate personal hygiene items, such as shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, body wash, toothbrush, toothpaste, pads, etc. We took another truckload of used clothing to Jenelle and dropped off at the end of July. Thanks to everyone who is donating their used clothes. This is such an amazing place to help. They are now called Embrace-A Center for Community. Mission Project of the Month: Back-

pack Pals. Our church is one of several area churches that donates to Backpack Pals. This program sends a bag home on Friday for kids to have some food and snacks to carry them through the weekend when they don't have access to breakfast and

lunch at school. The packing zone for this project is located in the basement of the Pleasant Valley Church of the Brethren in Weyers Cave. We purchase food from the Food Bank in Verona, Sharp Shopper, donations, and other places. The food that we get is distributed to the children at Clymore Elementary School. Each year we can have anywhere between 50-120 bags to give out each week. This helps keep our local children fed. It is a great outreach. On Monday, July 26th, I had set up a pre-arranged drop off with Jenelle Watson to drop off a second truckload of goodies for this group. She said we would meet around noon because the office wasn't still officially open. In case, you haven't heard the place is now called Embrace-A Center for Community. Jenelle shows up and must go through a back door and then come out to me.

There is another lady there and her name is Mary. She parks and comes up. I start asking her about some shoes and she says that she doesn't work there. Oh, I am sorry I just assumed. She said no I am picking up some stuff from Jenelle. Jenelle comes out with a shopping cart and then sees how much I have and says let me go get the rolling cart. I am talking to Mary and find out that she is picking up children's clothing that they can't use because the sizes were too small. Her church is doing a school drive and handing out school supplies. Embrace is donating the



clothes to them to hand out during their drive. So, I helped Mary load 11 huge bags into her SUV for their clothing give away. Mary helped me unload my truck to fill up the bins and push back into Embrace to later be sorted and given away.

Jenelle talked about this is what John Wesley wanted when he thought of making the United Methodist Church. All of us working together to help the people in this world. I thanked her for being the middleman and she just

pointed up in the air. She asked for us to share this story. This is our community, and we need to continue taking care of it the best that we know how. Mary was from Greenville UMC in Greenville, VA (on the south side of Staunton) and taking clothes for a school drive to give away down there. I was delivering clothes from Weyers Cave, VA to be used as they are needed. Both ends of the county coming together in Waynesboro and doing God's work to cover the whole area.
