### From the Pastor's Desk

#### **Called to Serve**

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit." (1 Corinthians 12:12-13)

November... we are so thankful for all of you that are part of this church. We hope that you get to have some family time and enjoy a wonderful Thanksgiving feast with loved ones.

A big Thank you to all who helped with the Community Trunk or Treat. If you helped with games, donations of candy, food, trunks, or anything that you did, it was so much appreciated. This event was a great outreach.

The envelopes are out for the Apple Tree Project from Kingsway Ministries. You pick an envelope with a child's name, age, and gift that they want. Please put your name on the list of the envelope that you take. We have worked with Kingsway Ministries for many years in providing presents to these dear children. There are lots of churches and organizations that help provide this service. Please have unwrapped gifts back to the church by Nov. 14<sup>th</sup>. If you would like to help with postage, please put it in the envelope. We are also taking donations of pencils, Chapstick's, 6 oz plastic tube of toothpaste, 5x8 mini writing pads with wide band at top, wrapping paper, and scotch tape. These donations are for the parents that are incarcerated. Pre-COVID, Kingsway would have volunteers wrap all the gifts, but now they just send wrapping paper and tape with the gifts for the guardians to wrap them. Thank you for all the donations.

Starting, Nov. 21<sup>st</sup>, we will have a fundraiser to help the Gideons collect money to purchase bibles to help spread the word of God. When we think about Christmas time, we think of presents. This will be a way for our youth to purchase a present for God. You give \$5 (which buys a Gideon regular bible or 3 small pocket size bibles) and you will receive an ornament that you put your name on and place on the small Christmas tree that we will have in the narthex. You can ask your family and friends for the \$5 donation to help purchase Bibles. We want to see how full we can make this tree of these Gideon ornaments.

please. You can also donate personal hygiene items, such as shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, body wash, toothbrush, toothpaste, pads, etc. Thanks to everyone who is donating their used clothes. This is such an amazing place to help. They are now called Embrace-A Center for Community. You can look them up online at embracewaynesboro.org.

**Mission Project of the Month:** Valley Mission in Staunton. Serving more than 700 unique individuals each year, the Valley Mission strives to promote self-sustainability through the provision of case management, pastoral counseling, financial assistance, and onsite enrichment programs including an afterschool program and onsite mental health counseling. We help restore the lives of people experiencing homelessness. We are **your** community homeless shelter, serving our neighbors in need—24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They have provided 3,300 bed nights, 53,479 free meals, 183 emergency food boxes, 764 after-school lessons, and 6,347 volunteer hours. This is a worthy mission that we give money to. Leslie Wagoner is still in a great deal of pain. She is waiting on blood work to be able to get an injection in her back. Her first injection helped the pain tremendously and she is hoping for the same result when is able to get one. Please continue to pray for her as she deals with the pain in her back and legs and pray she will be able to get scheduled for her injection soon!

Libby Riddle had a 12 hour surgery to remove her appendix with the primary tumor, her gall bladder, spleen, a total hysterectomy, part of her colon and had to strip her diaphragm muscle. Her surgeon was able to get all of the tumor he could see. She then received heated chemo in her abdomen for two hours which should kill any remaining cells. She has a slow recovery ahead of her. Please pray for rapid healing and no sign of the return of he tumor. She thanks everyone for their prayers.

Faye Youmans is recovering from shingles which affected the nerves in her arm and shoulder. She was doing rehab to get movement back in her shoulder and to relieve the pain.

Lloyd Meadows had an MRI on Thursday and unfortunately, they got the news they had been dreading. The chemo is no longer working and the tumors are growing. He will keep receiving infusions every two weeks for swelling and slowing down the productions of cancer cells, but no more chemo. Lloyd feels pretty good but struggles to get around because he is so dizzy and he tires very easily. Please continue to pray for peace and comfort for Lloyd and Susan. They will need it in the days to come. Susan says "even though the news was not great - we are not done fighting. Lloyd is tough, he is loved, and he has a desire to keep going! He will continue to enjoy each day and we will keep our faces toward the Son!"
