Time for God

Scripture reminds us that Jesus took time away from his active ministry for prayer and reflection. To grow closer to God, in our walk with Christ, we need to do the same. As I've mentioned before, my morning routine includes setting aside time for reading scripture, other devotional



materials, and prayer. This practice has helped me to grow in my faith and understanding, and I want to encourage each of you to give it a try! I want to share a simple template which you may choose to use to help structure your own unique morning devotional time with God.
