### From the Pastor's Desk

#### Diversity in the "Body of Christ"

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. (1 Corinthians 12:27-31)

In this scripture passage the Apostle Paul talks about his inspired idea of the church as the "Body of Christ." We can glean many important insights from this way of thinking about the church:

- Each person in the church is like a different part of the body
- Each person is unique
- Each of us have differing abilities
- Each of us have an important role to play

The body can't function well without each of us doing our part

So, it is part of God's plan that we are each unique individuals. That each person is different. We call these differences diversity. And diversity is a good thing! Sometimes these differences can be a source of tension in a community of people. But diversity is also a source of strength. Our different insights and abilities complement each other. We all have blind spots. But, working together, we complement each other's vision of the world, so we have fewer blind spots and see more clearly together than by ourselves. This is one of the reasons why, when someone disagrees with the way you see or think about something you should consider it a blessing and not an obstacle.

Not only do we all have different perspectives (viewpoints), but we also have different abilities. Our differing abilities make us able to fulfill different functions in the church. Paul says:

"And in the church God has appointed first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, also those having gifts of healing, those able to help others, those with gifts of administration, and those speaking in different kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?

It is part of God's plan that we all have differing abilities in the church so that we can fulfill different roles. In addition to our diversity, we also can see that each (and every) person has an important role to play. We are all called to participate in our own unique ways. We are all called to ministry together. A body is healthy when all parts are doing their jobs, working together in harmony, and with a unified purpose. It is the same for the church.

What part have you been called to play in this church? Are you using the gifts that God has given you to build up the church? If not, how might you be able to develop and use these gifts to glorify God? These questions are more important than ever as we seek to remain connected and functioning as a "Body" in the midst of a time when staying connected is such a challenge. I invite you to spend some time in prayer this week asking God to show you the role you have been called to play in this "Body of Christ" that we call Bethany United Methodist Church.

A huge THANK YOU to all those who contributed shoes for Soles4Souls until Easter Sunday. We ended up with 217 pairs of shoes. WOW!!! I am blown out of the water with all these shoes. We did have some single shoes donated, so if you are missing a shoe, please check in the kitchen to see if your match is there.

Our next gathering of materials will be making the hygiene kits for Annual Conference. Items needed:

- One hand towel (15x25 17x27 inches) No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels
- One washcloth No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One Comb Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks. Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper No emery boards or metal nail files
- One Bath-size soap ( 3 oz. bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging.
- One adult toothbrush Do not remove from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches) -Common household bandages acceptable
- One 1-gallon size re-sealable bag

#### Assembly instructions ...

- 1. Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- 2. Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- 3. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- 4. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- 5. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- 6. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

You can put whole kits together or bring in items and we can combine to make the kits. They will be due to the church by Memorial Day weekend. Thank you for these donations.

So, if you have any clothing that you want to get rid of and it has no stains or rips, please label it with EMBRACE and leave in the social hall.

### Treasurer's Report by Cindy Kite

I'm just going to jump right into numbers, money, giving, and expenses. It will be like ripping off a band aid quickly so it's less painful. So here goes ...

We need \$4,311.85 each week to meet our budget. Our average per week this year has been \$3,104.92 making us \$19,310.83 behind our 2022 budget. That's a lot! And yes, we did miss two Sundays this year due to inclement weather and have not been able to make that offering up so far. Last year at this time, we were only 12.6% or \$8,552.02 behind the budget. We've thankfully collected \$49,678.77 in giving; however, our expenses thru today total \$52,042.88. If we haven't collected as much as our expenses are, how can we be paying our bills, you wonder. Well, because we have funds left over from last year which have been helping us keep up with our expenses. But that excess from last year won't last forever!

Even though there are more people attending worship service each Sunday, our giving is down from last year. We are so very fortunate to have such awesome folks within our congregation who supported the church though such tough times. When many churches closed their doors, we were able to not only survive, but thrive. Thank you for helping to get Bethany through those difficult times! I'm asking you to once again step up and help Bethany get through yet another tough time! We only survive due to your generosity. If you are giving on a regular basis, or even a not so regular basis, thank you so very much! If you haven't been giving, please prayerfully consider it (every little bit counts). It helps us keep the lights and heat on each Sunday morning! Just for you!

We look forward to recognizing our high school and college graduates and celebrating with them at a reception immediately after the service.


