United as One in Worship – 240th Session of the Virginia Annual Conference

The Annual Conference this year was held in Hampton, VA.

The Laity Session was better than it has been in a long time.

Laity and Clergy Sessions convene before the opening session of Annual Conference.

The speaker for the Laity Session was Kay Kotan.

- Methodism is a movement working together.
- John Wesley was a huge proponent of the laity. We're all called to ministry.
- There is no such thing as "just" Laity.
- God is on the move in the church today.
- We have to change our thinking to meet people where they are.We're experiencing Holy Disruption. Holy Disruption has a purpose. We need to let God Lead us. Time to open our minds, eyes and hearts.

The opening prayers were offered by the oldest member and youngest member of the Annual Conference.

Worship isn't about us. True worship is about a relationship with our Savior.

Laity Address was giving by Matha Stokes, Conference Lay Leader.

- We must sing a new song.
- Our doctrine stays the same.
- We can do so much more together than apart.

Cabinet Report was heavily debated as there was a debate over Paragraph 2553 which provides the provisions for a church to disaffiliate. If a church decides to separate from the UMC they must use paragraph 2553 of the Book of Discipline.

There was a motion that passed to better fund the Conference Youth. The motion was to give the Youth unused Legal Defense funds to the youth program.

The District Initiative was presented. The funding for the 2 District Directors that will be hired will come from the Conference for the first 3 years. After that the funds will come from the District Budget. There was a called District Conference to dissolve the Harrisonburg and Northwestern Virginia districts and to create the Shenandoah River District. The District Offices are now in Toms Brook, VA.

The Team Jeremiah report was postponed due to lack of time. The report was given in a special session in July. I attended the virtual meet of the Jeremiah Report. One important thing that came from this meeting was that the first 4 paragraphs of the Discipline of the UMC cannot



be changed. Those paragraphs are below. Another issue we're waiting on information about is whether the General Conference in 2024 will be a postponed Conference or a New Conference. If it is a new conference then new motions will have to be created and presented to be considered.

Retirees were recognized in a service.

Green Church Awards were given to Ivey Memorial UMC and Bethlehem UMC.

There were several Relationship Partner Reports. Pinnacle Living- UMC Retirement Homes, Heart Havens- homes for disabled adults, and UM Family Services were highlighted.

Those elected to Boards and Agencies were consecrated.

Statistician's and Treasurer's Reports were given. If you would like more detail about this report see or email me.

The Council of Finance and Administration report was voted on. This is when the Conference Budget was approved. The apportionments were reduced by 0.03% overall. Apportionments are what each church pays to the Conference to support the work of the Conference.

Kits were collected before going to the Conference.

- Total Kits 18,560
- For a value of \$298,724.90
- Cans 4 Conference 12,221

This year's Annual Conference has been more than the meeting in June. There have been several meetings since then and there may be more before next June.

The Articles of Religion of the Methodist Church

The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church - 2016

Article I — Of Faith in the Holy Trinity

There is but one living and true God, everlasting, without body or parts, of infinite power, wisdom, and goodness; the

maker and preserver of all things, both visible and invisible. And in unity of this Godhead there are three persons, of one substance, power, and eternity—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

Article II — Of the Word, or Son of God, Who Was Made Very Man

The Son, who is the Word of the Father, the very and eternal God, of one substance with the Father, took man's nature in the womb of the blessed Virgin; so that two whole and perfect natures, that is to say, the Godhead and Manhood, were joined together in one person, never to be divided; whereof is one Christ, very God and very Man, who truly suffered, was crucified, dead, and buried, to reconcile his Father to us, and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for actual sins of men.

Article III — Of the Resurrection of Christ

Christ did truly rise again from the dead, and took again his body, with all things appertaining to the perfection of man's nature, wherewith he ascended into heaven, and there sitteth until he return to judge all men at the last day.

Article IV — Of the Holy Ghost

The Holy Ghost, proceeding from the Father and the Son, is of one substance, majesty, and glory with the Father and the Son, very and eternal God.

-Special Called Annual Conferences - So far there have been 2 called Annual Conferences to vote on churches wishing to disaffiliate with the United Methodist Church. The first 3 churches disaffiliated with ¶ 2549.3. This was the only way possible to disaffiliate prior to ¶ 2553. With the first 3 churches their property is returned to Annual Conference Trustees and then the churches must buy their property back. These churches include, New Hope UMC, Mountain View District Lafayette UMC, Valley Ridge District Starr-Bolar

Due to Cindy being sick, the 2022 financial report is still being worked on. A full 2022 financial report will be in the February 2023 edition of The Echo. If you have questions or concerns before then, please contact Cindy Kite at office.bethany@gmail.com. UMC, Valley Ridge District.

The second Special Annual Conference was to vote on 10 churches who wish to disaffiliate with ¶ 2553. This requires paying of 2 years of Apportionments and their portion of the liability for the Pension plan for those who are on the plan. This is mostly pastors but there are some other employees that are in the VA Pension Plan. These churches are listed below. This process takes a lot of time as it begins with a meeting for discernment with the District Superintendent and then the church is to meet and pray for discernment. A vote by 3 of the church membership is also needed to move forward then the church employs a lawyer to help them through the process. Center Point UMC, Mountain View District Harmony UMC, Mountain View District Mountain View UMC (Forest), Mountain View District Payneton UMC, Mountain View District Swansonville UMC, Mountain View District Hobson's Chapel UMC, Living Waters District Payne Memorial UMC, Living Waters District Painter-Garrison's UMC, Coastal Virginia District Crums UMC, Shenandoah River District Harriston UMC, Shenandoah River District

Members of each of these churches are given an opportunity to join another UMC if they still wish to be members of the United Methodist Church.

2023 Church Budget

Our 2023 budget of \$225,467.00 was voted on and approved at the last Church Council Meeting. This means we need weekly contributions of \$4,335.90 to keep up with our budget, which is a little more than in 2022. So we can get there, think about increasing your 2023 giving by \$5, \$10 or \$50 per week or month. If everyone did that, we would meet our budget and have some to spare. I challenge each of you to increase your giving ... just a little ... in 2023! Or if you don't give, start giving. Even \$5 or \$10 a week will help us meet our budget.
