What is Happening? by Lori Mooney

I am questioning what is happening in the world today... I have lots of questions about many things, but for this article I am asking "Why are people turning away from God and the church community?"

I know growing up in the 8os, our parents expected us to go to church every Sunday. I knew it was a given. I enjoyed going to church. I liked the sermons, enjoyed visiting with other people that were there, enjoyed youth group, VBS in the summer, and all the activities that we did.

I have read several articles about the declining populations within churches, and it is a cause for concern. I am thankful that we were sent a young and vibrant pastor that is enthusiastic about this church. But when you read a statistic that states 4,500 churches closed in 2019, while only 3,000 were started and that was before Covid hit. We know the numbers have only gotten worse since the pandemic. Also, 41.5% of Americans between 18 and 29 said they never attend services. When you look at most churches, you have the older generations that have been attending all their life, but when they pass away are there going to be enough young people to sit in the pews and take over what the church has been accomplishing for years? So, many churches that have been here for 150+ years and then they must close their doors because they have so few attending or the building needs updates that they can't afford to fix.

Numbers were declining before Covid hit, but with churches having to stop in-person services and having to go to

online services, then trying to recover from that has been exhausting. One survey said that a typical church is now 85% of pre-pandemic levels. Lifeway surveyed young adults, aged 18-22 who attended church regularly and the firm found that 7 out of 10 had stopped attending church on a regular basis. Their research team stated, "The younger generation just doesn't feel like they're being accepted in a church environment or some of their choices aren't being accepted." We need to accept them for who they are. What is the United Methodists trademark phrase "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors." Let's think about this, are we really doing this right now in our congregations?

One in 4 Americans said in 2022 that they attend church regularly. Congregations are struggling. Ponder on this quote from Religion News Service- "The focus should be, how can we become a better church-rather than how do we re-create what we used to have?"

For us to turn this around, we need to attract all ages to our church to keep it going, but especially the young people. Come back to church if you are still staying at home on Sunday mornings, we need you. Pastor Blaine wants us all to become a better church. So, put your best foot forward and keep living the life you are and plan on trying to bring others into our flock. Show God's love to everyone and in all that you do. From James 4:12 "There is only one Lawgiver and Judge, the one who is able to save and destroy. But you-who are you to judge your neighbor?" Let's open our hearts and arms to all those that need Jesus Christ in their lives. We need to put people in the pews to listen to what Pastor Blaine has to say, and we need people to go out and be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ and help our neighbors. After all, the Bethany vision statement is: CONNECT with God in community, GROW in our likeness to Jesus Christ, and SERVE our neighbors.

There have been different kits needed at times. These kits help the UMC respond quickly and many times the UMC is the first to respond to disasters due to the kits.

One year, a missionary talked at the Annual Conference about how the children where she was serving got so excited when the School Kits were delivered. Being a connectional church allows us to have a significant impact around the world. I am pleased to partner with Bethany's missions committee to work on these kits. At this point we will be focusing on Hygiene Kits unless we hear differently from Annual Conference. We will be putting out
