From the Pastor's Desk

Did you know that April is National Poetry Month?? Well if you didn't, now you do! As most of you have probably guessed by now, I am not much of a poem fanatic, but I do appreciate those who have the gift of poetry. Those who can write and read poetry have a special gift of patience and grace about themselves. My 10th grade English teacher infatuation with well-known American poets, Emily Dickinson and Walt Whitman. For one class, we had to pick a poem from one of these two poets that was inspiring and something that we could expand upon. One of the poems was written by Dickinson, and it was called "If I can stop one heart from breaking." It reads:

"If I can stop one heart from breaking,
I shall not live in vain;
If I can ease one life the aching,
Or cool one pain,
Or help one fainting robin
Unto his nest again,
I shall not live in vain."

Dickinson, who was what one would call an introvert these days, writes in a simplistic, yet beautiful way. Her call or challenge she leaves the reader with is one that I think our Bethany family needs to hear, in this season. We are called to help lighten the load of those around us and to support those who need it. As followers of the one true King, we ought to live a life that brings pure joy, not just happiness to those around us. I know it is impossible to please everyone, and that is not what this poem or our call is about. When we pause and listen to what is going

on in those around us, I would bet there is a need for a hand up, shoulder to cry on, or some type of reminder to let them know they are not alone, in their despair. Let us be more aware of who is not in worship on Sundays, and aware of those neighbors who seem to be carrying a heavy burden. May we as people of Jesus be people who ease one's suffering, by joining them, holding them, and being open to hear what they have to say. I want to leave you all with a quote from one of my favorite college professors:

"When you interact with someone, help to lighten the load. Inspire people to know that things are possible."

It is springtime! Flowers are blooming, trees are budding out, and the weather is getting warmer (even though we really didn't have much of a winter). Happy Easter from the Adult Mission Team!! He has risen!

Congratulations to Pastor Blaine and Pastor Ashley on their upcoming wedding day, April 15!

On Ash Wednesday, we put together 19 female kits and 23 male kits, with about 5 kits from the leftover items. Thank you for all the donations for this and putting them together that night.

We raised \$456 for Back Woods Lunches on Communion Sunday in March when we took up the special offering. Thank you for the donations because this will help for about a month to feed our food pantry neighbors hot meals on Monday afternoon.

Great Community Give is on Wednesday, April 19. This is their sixth year, and they have 143 awesome organizations to choose from. They are looking to raise \$2 million. If you would like to help one of the many organizations in the valley, please go to www.greatcommunitygive.org.

RAM (Remote Area Medical) Clinic will be coming to the Rockingham County Fairgrounds on Saturday, May 6 from 6 am to 6 pm and on Sunday, May 7 from 6 am to noon. This is a free medical, dental, and vision clinic for anyone who needs it. It is completely free, no pre-registration needed, or no-insurance needed. People usually start showing up at midnight on Friday to get in line for this event. We have signed up to bring some food items for the people waiting and the volunteers working that day. We need the following donated:

- 25 regular Jell-O cups
- 24 cans of diet soda
- 24 cans of soda
- 20 "Juicy Juice" juice packs (and it has to be this brand)
- 25 full-size candy bars
- and 40 packets of hot cocoa.

Please have these to the church by April 23. If we have extra donations of these items, then they will be given to Backpack Pals. They are asking for volunteers to help with set up and take down and parking. If anyone is interested, please let me know and I will get you connected with the right person. Monetary donations are also being accepted to help cover the cost for housing for the doctors and nurses who have volunteered their time.

Mission spotlight of the month: Blue Ridge CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) for Children is a nonprofit organization advocating for children who have experienced abuse and/or neglect through recruitment, training, and supervision of community volunteers. Every abused and neglected child will have a trained volunteer advocating for their best interest. Children taken from their home and put in foster care will have someone to lean on that will get to know them, their parents, and their foster parents and help them get through it all. If you would like to make a special donation, please mark it in the memo line for Blue Ridge CASA.

SEEING A NEED

In the last few days of my dad's life, one of the nurses dropped by his room and asked me if she could give him a shave. As Rachel gently pulled the razor across his face, she explained, "Older men of his generation like to have a neat shave every day." Rachel had seen a need and acted on her instinct to show kindness, dignity, and respect to someone. The tender card she provided reminded me of my friend Julie who still paints her elderly mother's nails because it's important to her mom that she "look pretty."

Acts 9 tells us about a disciple named Dorcas (also known as Tabitha) who showed kindness by providing handmade clothing for the poor (vs 36, 39). When she died, her room was

filled with friends who tearfully mourned this kind woman who loved helping others.

But Dorcas' story didn't end there. When Peter was brought to where her body lay, he knelt and prayed. In God's power, he called her by name saying, "Tabitha, get up" (vs 40). Amazingly, Dorcas opened her eyes and rose to her feet. When her friends realized she was alive, word spread quickly through the town and "many peopled believed in the Lord (vs 42).

And how did Dorcas spend the next day of her life? Probably exactly as she had before - seeing the needs of people and filling them.

Whom do you know that always seems to find ways to help others? What can you do to become more award of other's needs?

Prayer: Father, open my eyes each day to see the hurting and needy people around me. Open my heart to do what I can to show them what God's love looks like. Amen.

UMCOR Hygiene Kits

This June we will be sending Hygiene Kits with Rosemary Wagoner to the United Methodist Conference. We will collect kits from April 17 thru May 19. There will be a basket in the foyer for your donations. You can either donate items, prepare a kit yourself or donate money to help purchase items to put together kits. It cost \$12 per kit.

Here is a list of items that are needed to prepare a hygiene kit ...

- One hand towel (15x25 17x27 inches) No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels
- One washcloth No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One Comb Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks. Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper No emery boards or metal nail files
- One Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging.
- One adult toothbrush Do not remove from packaging.
 Personal advertising not acceptable. Do not include toothpaste!

- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches) Common household bandages acceptable
- One 1-gallon size re-sealable bag

Assembly instructions ...

- 1. Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- 2. Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- 3. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- 4. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- 5. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- 6. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

All items must be new. Do not wash any of the items as they will no longer be considered new. Do not include any personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits. Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters,

advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Financial Update by Cindy Kite

March is coming to an end. And as it goes away, so does the positive number for our church finances. Last month, I was so excited to announce that we were in the black for the first time during the first quarter of a year. I'm sorry to say ... it didn't last! I'm still excited about were we are; however, there is always room for improvement.

We are \$1,413.92 behind were we should be this time of the year. That's -2.7%. It's so much better than last year at this time. We were over \$14,000 or 29.6% behind our projected budget. So it's good news and bad news, all at the same time.

Good news. And bad news. All at the same time. I've been in the middle of the good news and bad news all week. Our granddaughter came six weeks early and she's currently at UVA. The good news and bad ... she was born at a place that knew exactly what they needed to do and the bad news ... she's little. Really little. Good news ... she has the best nurses and doctors attending to her while she's in the NICU. The bad news is that she's there and not home with her family. This is where my faith in God has carried me through and many prayers have been sent on her behalf. It's also a time where I can praise God and thank him for the blessings he has given us ... her. God sent her and has kept her safe and healthy.

Good news is we are able to pay all our bills. Pay our staff ... thank you! Continue with our ministries. And do events for our community like the Easter Egg Hunt.

Let's trust that God will provide for all we need. Let's continue to pray for Bethany. Asking for folks to volunteer their time, serve on a committee and continue to support us with their finances. All for the glory of God!!

"I just can't take that chance."


What is the Resurrection: A Child's Answer (a true story)
