UMCOR Hygiene Kits

This June we will be sending Hygiene Kits with Rosemary Wagoner to the United Methodist Conference. We will begin collecting items to prepare hygiene kits from April 17 - May 19. You can either donate items, prepare a kit yourself or donate money to help purchase items to put together kits. It cost \$12 per kit.

Here is a list of items that are needed to prepare a hygiene kit ...

- One hand towel (15x25 17x27 inches) No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels
- One washcloth No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One Comb Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks. Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper No emery boards or metal nail files
- One Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging.
- One adult toothbrush Do not remove from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches) Common household bandages acceptable
- One 1-gallon size re-sealable bag

Assembly instructions ...

- 1. Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- 2. Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- 3. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- 4. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- 5. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- 6. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

There is a basket in the foyer for your donations. If you would like to make a monetary donation, please place it in the offering plate with a note saying it's for "Kits for Conference."

It's May! A new month with many new beginnings! Trees have shed off winter and now have beautiful green leaves. Azaleas have come out of hibernation and now have new blooms of bright red, pink or white. It's time to plant vegetable and flower gardens. The bees are busy flying from flower to flower. Go outside and take a moment to look around you at God's beautiful work. God has made all things new again! And he can do the same thing for you!

Another new thing is that we are only 9% behind our budget instead of 23% like last year. I know many of you are giving on a regular basis. But many of you aren't. If you miss a Sunday, that giving is usually forgotten about. If we all gave on a regular basis, we wouldn't be 9% behind our budget. We would keep up with our budget or even surpass it. Wouldn't that be awesome!

One way to keep giving on a regular basis is to use the online giving link you can find on our website. Then even if you miss a Sunday, your giving will be automatically sent to the church. You can set it up to give every week, once a month, or just a one-time donation. I use the online giving myself and give once a month. I don't have to think about bringing the check I wrote and left on my desk, or whether I've given this month? Setting it up is very easy. Take a

As of April 23, our giving totals \$67,084.86 which averages out to \$3,946.16 per week. We need a total of \$4,335.90 per week to maintain our budget of \$225,467.00. Our expenses total \$54,849.44 with invoices totaling \$6,974.57 still owing. All that means we are still in the black by \$5,360.85. Right now we are not using all of our budget each month. That's why we have a surplus so far this year. January and February were very good giving months; however, March and April have not been. Let's make May a great month and June an outstanding month! That's a challenge I make to each of you!
