A Special Opportunity by Pat Lynn

I was given an opportunity not given to many. That opportunity was to rear a special needs daughter. You all know Pam. I had a long labor with her so always thought that was the reason for her condition. She was first diagnosed with cerebral palsy which means she probably had what the doctor said an insult at birth. This was a nice way to say brain damage from slight oxygen deficit. She has also been given other labels like Rubinstein Tabi and autism.

In spite of all this she met her milestones within the normal range. We had her in all kinds of programs to improve her progress; i.e., movement education, swimming, speech therapy. She loved reading and I give Sesame Street and Electric Company credit for teaching her to read. She was reading many words by the time she was four years old.

Her kindergarten teacher sent her to second grade to read. A kid in her class told his mother that there was a girl in his class who didn't know how to play but boy could she read. Because of her reading and spelling ability she tested really high on psychological scales. Her biggest problem was social. She didn't meet any criteria for educational placement. She attended Anthony Seeger Campus School through 6th grade and Augusta County Schools for middle school in self contained classes even though she didn't fit.

In the meantime I began researching schools. We found one in Texas and one in



and stayed until she was 21. We opted not to take the high school diploma until she was 21 because that was the cut off age for special Ed. She completed all the requirements for regular diplomas for the stare of Pennsylvania and for the state of Virginia. When she came home, we received services through Valley Associated for Independent Living, Through their efforts Pam worked at Blockbuster Video for 5 years and at Walmart for 15 years. She also has had day support which means she goes out with friends to have fun. She has been in swimming and bowling with special Olympics. She has had a brain tumor, benign, an ulcer and migratory

Pennsylvania, the Pathway School, that seemed to meet her needs. She was 15 when she went there as a resident

she has had a brain tumor, benign, an ulcer and migratory arthritis. She has glaucoma and a macular problem. She had cataracts removed which improved her vision. She now has some back issues that will probably require surgery. The surgeon who removed her tumor had never

> been satisfied with her diagnosis and sent her to a geneticist. That is when we found that she has been mis-diagnosed her whole life. She has a rare genetic mutation called Coffin Siris Syndrome. Her's is the AIRD1B gene. She is proud to be unique she says. She'd is one in 10 million.

> Our family here at Bethany has been so supportive of her and of us all along the way. God's love has guided us and given us strength through the rearing of Pam and her sisters. Thank you Bethany family for you love for her and for us.
