
another example of a growing heart, of becoming a faithful servant of our Lord.

A Member's Thoughts by Jenn McLaughlin


"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them." Luke 2:1-7

One of my favorite Christmas traditions each year is reading the story of Jesus' birth as told in the gospel of Luke. When I was growing up it was my dad's family that started this tradition in my life. The extended family, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins would gather for a meal. Afterwards, the kids would impatiently wait as the adults drank their coffee, visited with one another, and then cleared and cleaned the table. Finally, it would be time to gather together around the living room where all the presents were piled.

The wait for presents always seemed "forever" to my young self, and it wasn't over yet. Before a single gift was unwrapped, my grandfather would take up his bible and open to Luke chapter two for the story of the first Christmas gift. A Savior.

As a small child I never appreciated the reading of Jesus' birth. It seemed to me in those early years it was just another delay before the excitement of shiny new gifts. As I grew older the reading of Jesus' birth began to take on new meaning for me. I began to understand that this small



baby was the gift, and not all the presents waiting to be unwrapped.

Now as an adult I'm even more grateful for this Christmas tradition. My dad's family still gathers together to celebrate Christmas (this year Jeremy and I will be hosting). The faces at this gathering have changed over the years. There have been new additions to the family through marriages and births, as well as losses through the years. It isn't my grandfather's strong but gentle voice reading the words, but different generations.

Yes, there have been changes through the years, but the story remains the same, and now I have the honor of sharing this tradition with my children. Sharing the story of the greatest gift we have ever received, the gift of our Savior and King, Jesus!
