Looking Back at the Past and Ahead to the Future by Jackie Dunsmore

2024! Happy New Year and Happy 70th Anniversary Bethany! Honestly, when Cindy asked me to write this I just couldn't get started. I have so many feelings in so many different directions about 2023, Bethany and 70 years of God's faithfulness. It is difficult to put into words.

I haven't been here all 70 years, but I'm blessed to have been a member at Bethany most of them. My faith was born and nurtured here. I have fond memories of Sunday School where Carolyn Roller and Louise Byers taught Bible stories and Ms. Byers challenged us to memorize the books of the Bible in order (I didn't quite make it!). I remember Mr. Boyd VanPelt handing out sticks of gum after every service and belting out his wonderful baritone voice with every hymn. I am grateful for Pastor Jim Harris who had a profound impact on my life as a teenager and Stanley and Mae Houff, and Debbie and Sam Saufley as youth leaders. There were Christmas programs and cantatas and lots of music. There was Pat and Lois Lamb who challenged our church to become more mission-minded and whose influence helped create the mission-focused church we are today. I remember apple butter making, fall festivals, beef barbeque dinners, retreats at Camp Overlook, revivals, homecomings, Vacation Bible Schools, and food, always food at every fellowship event. On our wedding day, as I was ready to walk down the aisle with my dad, I remember standing on a concrete slab of the new addition (no roof yet). Glad it wasn't raining!

Tears stream down as I remember these many things and so many more with such gratitude to those mentioned and others, many who have gone to be with Jesus. I'm thankful that I grew up in and still belong to a church of faithful folks who love God, love each other, love the children and youth and encourage each one as if they were their own.

Let's also not forget that life is real. There were struggles... societal changes... financial hardships... conflict... shared tragedies... changes in worship... times of questioning... maybe even complacency and doubt. As we know, a church family is made up of people and we people can be... well... people! Yet through it all God's faithfulness remained steadfast and the church on the hill continued in worship, ministry and love for our community and one another.

2023 has been a difficult year in almost every facet of our lives. Coming out of Covid, we must admit that our world is quite a mess. Besides living in a world besieged in war and poverty, our own governments inability to accomplish much of anything, an unsettled often angry society where we seem to be hyper-focused on what divides us rather than what brings us together, we also have our own family and personal struggles that can often seem overwhelming. The statistics tell us that MOST of the people in our community are indifferent to God and even more so to the established church. They won't come to us. We must reach out to them. What will that look like? How do we share Jesus with folks who don't even realize they need him? This is the challenge of the future. I don't know the answers, but I do know that I am excited and ready to join hands with my church family as we pray, seek and follow God's direction for our church in 2024. God has and will be faithful and he has the plan for Bethany's part in the redemption of His world. One thing I know for sure... it begins and ends with love... and my Bethany family... Hove you.


BUM Christmas Post Office


This year at Annual Conference Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson made an effort to return the Annual Conference back to John Wesley's purpose for AC of being in mission and discussing what should be preached about.

There were limited meetings outside of conference business and opportunities to network with each other and be in mission. The Laity session was held before conference started. There was an evening event just focused on Mission. A display of ways we're in Mission will be in the lobby soon. One mission close by is the Embrace Center in Waynesboro.

Other interesting things were bringing back Resolutions. Resolutions usually call for the conference to take a stand on an assortment of church rulings. Another notable vote

was asking the conference to support the Christmas Covenant which will create regional conferences. There are times at General Conference when issues are discussed that don't affect all the conferences at General Conference. One example is the pension and liability issue in the US. It is rather complicated and took many hours to make sure we're in compliance but it doesn't affect those outside of the US, and this motion was approved. Another thing that was different is the Ordination service which was held during a session during the day. It was after the Retirement Service. I think it is fitting to see the new classes of ministers after celebrating the many years of service by those retiring.
