
From the Pastor's Desk ...

Dear Beloved Bethany UMC Family,

This past month I ventured down I-81 to Charlotte, NC for the National Fresh Expressions Conference. This conference was jam packed with speakers and pastors from all over the country and all over the UMC connection; sharing their own stories and experiences of what Fresh Expressions is doing in their own context. Fresh Expressions is a movement to build relationships with people in our community who are longing to be a part of an intentional community. Some examples of Fresh Expressions are Brew Theology that can happen at a brewery or coffee shop; or Tattoo Church that occur at a local tattoo parlor and reach a community that might not be as comfortable in the church building. Fresh Expressions ought not to try to be mimicked by other types of Fresh Expressions; but need to be open to what our community needs and wants. Fresh Expressions can work alongside the local church and provide an avenue to transform the lives in our community and engage in deeper friendships.

The Great Commission that Jesus gives us is in Matthew 28 says to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." The way we can begin to do this is by beginning to listen and engage in conversation with those who we often pass in our business of life. A Fresh Expression is not about



saving souls, but it is about offering authentic relationships and seeking to transform our community, and if someone comes to Jesus by it, then that is an added blessing.

The first step in investing in our community is to truly listen to people in and around where you live, work, and socialize; to see what our community needs. This is where YOU come in! I want the people of Bethany UMC to begin to step outside of our comfort zones and our circles, to really listen to what those in the community could benefit from. Maybe this means having a legitimate conversation with the person checking you out at the grocery store. Or asking the person who is making your coffee at the coffee shop what they would like to see in our area to enrich their life. If we can start having these conversations with our neighbors, maybe we can begin to transform our area into the place

we want it to be. So, for the next couple months I want to encourage you to engage in these life-giving conversations in our local area; in hopes for us to work together to find a new and creative way to reach our community and provide an avenue for community transformation. I look forward to listening to you all and hearing your ideas, hopes, and dreams for this future way of being the Church and the faithful people of Bethany UMC!

2024 started out with us missing the very first Sunday due to a power outage! That means we missed an entire Sunday of giving. And most of the time, we don't think about making up a missed Sunday offering. And most of you didn't. Even though we missed a Sunday in January, we did amazingly good. We went from a deficit of 100% to only 12.1%.

The first Sunday in February was great! Our deficit went from 12.1% to only 8.5%, which isn't bad considering the missed Sunday in January. However, that trend did not stick around long in February. At the end of February we have a deficit of 17.2% or the \$5,951.08 as the chart shows. Winter months, especially February for some reason, are slow in giving. Maybe it's because folks don't come out to church as often when it's cold, windy or rainy. And that's a good reason to sign up for online giving. 
