From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Siblings in Christ,

As October begins, I find myself, probably like the rest of you, starting to get annoyed or at least tired of the number of political signs and ads that are everywhere. No offense to any of our candidates running, but when I am watching college football on Saturday, I do not to be reminded of the American political system and all the joy it brings to all of us (insert sarcasm.) It is safe to say I could totally go the afternoon without seeing a multitude of political ads, often degrading the other candidates. But as November 5 approaches, I have been wrestling with what our job as followers of Jesus looks like on Election Day. In fact, I shared last month with the Donuts and Devotions guys about what John Wesley said about Christians and voting in elections; and I'd like to share that as a way to navigate this divisive season.

On October 6 in 1774 (just a few years ago) John Wesley wrote in his journal about his interactions with those in his Christian society, regarding the upcoming elections in England. Wesley suggested three keys to voting: 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy.

2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against.

3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.

When I look at these three principles it reminds me of the importance of voting in elections for those who follow Jesus; but also highlights maybe even more important than who one votes for, is how those who vote ought to act in response. My

hope and prayer for us at Bethany, but also for the church in the world is to remember that Christ is King, and that as the election creeps closer, we do not forget the Greatest commandment;

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind" AND "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Friends, our neighbors do not only include those who vote the same as us, but those who vote differently. So, when the political vitriol gets ramped up and you feel the need to "share" your political opinions with someone who you disagree with, let us remember the greatest commandment that Jesus gives us. Because we can be better, my friends. Let the Church be a place where love, grace, and respect for one another guide us, in a world that needs more healing and less division.

Financial Update by Cindy Kite

Fall has arrived and with it comes cooler temperatures, colorful leaves, pumpkins, college football, sweaters and sweatshirts and of course, pumpkin spice everything! At the end of September we are officially three quarters of the way through another year. Which means we only have three more months to make up a deficit of \$15,699.39.

Our 2024 budget was set at \$226,345.00. That means we need to collect \$4,328.71 every week of the year. We



have fallen behind by \$15,699.39 or 9.8%. On average we are collecting \$3,904.40 per week. The positive is that we are not spending as much as we have budgeted for expenses in 2024. Our bills are getting paid each month and so are our staff. If you haven't been as diligent about giving each week or month as you would have liked, it's not too late to make up those missed Sundays! Attention all church committee chairs! You should have received your 2025 budget request form by email. If you haven't, please let me know so that I can send you one. Those request forms are due back to me by Friday, Oct. 4. If you fail to turn in a budget request form, the Finance Committee will decide what your budget will be for 2025.
